PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Fake News!

We've been hearing more and more about it lately. Fake news is the reporting of inaccurate or false information with the outcome (whether intended or unintended) of manipulating and misleading one's audience. And with the advent of social media and its usage, it is everywhere, destroying the reputation of various people and broadening the political and ideological dividing line! Most incredible of all is how often we fall for it hook, line, and sinker. One early example of fake news was the 1938 radio dramatization of the novel, "The War of the Worlds," as told by narrator Orson Welles. In speaking of a Martian attack on New York City, a number of the American populace (albeit small) expressed panic at the thought of actually being attacked by Martian invaders. Fake News!

There is, however, news that is not fake. In fact, it is the way, the TRUTH, and the life! It is the news of God's love for us. 1 John 3:16 NLT says, "We know what real love is because Jesus gave up His life for us." God loved the world, all people of all time, so much, that He gave His one and only Son – who redeemed sinful mankind by His sacrifice on the cross. All who believe in Him (and this is true and not fake) receive forgiveness, life and eternal salvation!

The second part of 1 John 3:16 NLT says, "So we also ought to give up our lives for our brothers and sisters." John here reminds us that love, and its demonstration, often involves sacrifice. We often wonder whether we are prepared to lay down our lives in one great, dramatic, heroic gesture for another person, but for most of us, God calls us to lay down our lives piece by piece, little by little, in small, but

important ways every day. This comes with studying together, eating together, visiting together, laughing together, and praying together. God's love for us is real, and I pray that our love for each other to be the same. You can say we are church family and put it up in nice, big letters on the wall of the fellowship hall. **But** they'll know we are Christians by our love (John 13:35).

STEWARDSHIP AND EVANGELISM

What is one book of the Bible that Christians do not often read? Admittedly, I have never sat down and plugged through 1 and 2 Chronicles. But one book that is often avoided is the book of Revelation. Why is that? Perhaps it is because so much of the book is full of symbols and imagery that we, as 21st century westerners, do not easily understand, or perhaps it is because it is a bit daunting to think of the end times, and therefore easier to not read it. Thankfully, we are blessed with pastors who have studied it more in depth and can help us to understand as we read (and please note, Revelation is the Sunday morning Bible study topic now through spring!!! Please join us if you would like to dig in and understand a little better!). I have always been interested in learning about Revelation and have attempted to listen in on the Sunday morning class the past few weeks. When I have not been chasing my toddler around, it has been fascinating to learn about the seven ancient churches that Paul addressed in the beginning of Revelation. Even though those churches existed almost 2,000 years ago, they still contain valuable messages for the church today. What does God want in His church? What does He not want? According to Rev. 2-3...

The Church Should

- Have endurance
- Reject evil people
- Hold on to God's name
- Not deny the faith, even in the face of martyrdom
- Have love, faith, service, endurance
- Keep God's Word
- Not deny God's name

The Church Should Not

- Leave our first love (God)
- Be afraid of suffering
- Hold to immoral or idolatrous teachings
- Tolerate false prophets
- Seem alive outside but be dead inside
- Neglect opportunities to serve
- Be lukewarm
- Be ignorant of its own wretchedness

So what do we do with this list? Certainly, each church does some things very well but each church also struggles in some ways. Please take some time this month to reflect on the strengths and weaknesses of St. Andrew, and please pray that God would grant us the humility, wisdom, and ability to strengthen our church so that we can be a place for many from our community to hear His Word, partake of the Sacraments, and engage in fellowship that strengthens us all. The weather these past few weeks has been ever changing. From inches and inches of snow to extreme cold to somewhat normal Wisconsin winter temperatures. I haven't had to close school for several years and now I've had to several times! It was cold inside too, the school furnace went out and it took almost a week to get it replaced. Yes, it has been a month of troubles, personal heartbreak, sadness and grief for me. One cannot predict what lies ahead, and maybe that is a good thing. I believe I would have pulled the covers over my head right after the new year and still be there if I could. But the good news is that God is never changing. He is filled with compassion and love, and He promises He will never leave us nor forsake us. He is the warmth and comfort when the storms of this world surround us.

I would like to share an example of how God is working in our campus. This year two beautiful children came to us with hearts that were troubled, souls that were not trusting, and lives that were disruptive and confusing. These two siblings were in foster care along with their 2 year old brother. They were moved about to 6 different foster homes in a very short time. God, in His compassion, placed these children in the care of some incredible and loving people. This family came to me to see if I would let them enroll in 3K and 4K. This foster family says that this will be the last home for them, that they will do what needs to be done so that they can be their family and they already have 4 other

children! These foster parents are certainly the hands and feet of Jesus! I am very proud of our teaching staff and the compassion and care that is given these children. Each of them have their own special needs, each of them needed to know that they can trust us, each of them needed boundaries, guidance, direction, outlets for anger, and most of all love. These children are changing and the changes are a beautiful reminder of how God never leaves us nor forsakes us. God directed these children to our campus, to their new foster home, and to the faith that is growing in their hearts as they learn about Jesus and His love for them. All glory and praise to God almighty! Our ministry is blessed. Please keep these children in your prayers, keep their new foster parents in your prayers, and keep our teachers in your prayers. My prayer is that these children may flourish and grow in God's perfect love.
