OLD TESTAMENT LESSON Genesis 1:1-2, 1:26-31, 2:1-3
*In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. The earth
was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep.
And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters. Then
God said, let us make man in our image, after our likeness. And let
them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the
heavens and over the livestock and over all the earth and over every
creeping thing that creeps on the earth." So, God created man in his
own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he
created them. And God blessed them. And God said to them, "Be
fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion
over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over

*But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed
them: "Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known
to you, and give ear to my words. "Men of Israel, hear these words:
Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with mighty works and
wonders and signs that God did through him in your midst, as you
yourselves know this Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan
and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of
lawless men. God raised him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it
was not possible for him to be held by it. For David says concerning
him, "I saw the Lord always before me, for he is at my right hand that I
may not be shaken; therefore, my heart was glad, and my tongue
rejoiced; my flesh also will dwell in hope. For you will not abandon my
soul to Hades, or let your Holy One see corruption. You have made
known to me the paths of life; you will make me full of gladness with
your presence. Brothers, I may say to you with confidence about the
patriarch David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with

therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the
Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he has poured out this that you
yourselves are seeing and hearing. For David did not ascend into the
heavens, but he himself says, "The Lord said to my Lord, "Sit at my
right hand, until I make your enemies your footstool." Let all the house
of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord
and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified."*
