PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Practice Makes Perfect

About 4 years ago I was taking acoustic guitar lessons at a music shop in Lake Zurich, Illinois. It was my desire to learn a new musical instrument, and perhaps have some tunes ready for when baby number three (Joshua) finally arrived. The only problem is that I was never completely faithful in practicing the guitar apart from the lessons I received. And, of course, there was also the pleasant distraction involving the move up north to Wisconsin that took place during the months of March/April 2017. However, the biggest culprit of all is the lack of practice (and I do believe that practice makes perfect). So, after collecting dust in my office for almost three years, I finally gave my guitar over for my oldest to try his hand at.

Practice makes perfect. This is especially true in the context of the times we are living in today. With the spread of the coronavirus, we have been reminded to practice good hygiene—wash your hands, use sanitizer, and disinfect surfaces. We have also been taught the merits of social distancing – though, unlike the others, I prefer to see this as only a short-term practice and solution.

But now, what about fear? No amount of washing your hands can scrub away the fear that many people have been facing during the past couple months. And it doesn't help reading the doomsday headlines in the newspaper or on the TV screen that some folks in the media seem to enjoy peddling. Well, as a people of faith, we are called to trust God, rather than give in to fear and panic. All

throughout scripture "Be not afraid" is a common theme. Whether it involves the Israelites being trapped on the shores of the Red Sea with the Egyptian army coming up behind them...or facing a new enemy who were as terrifying giants in their own eyes (Numbers 13) — the word was, "Do not be afraid." That was also the message communicated by Christ and to Christians throughout the New Testament: "Do no be afraid." For God is with you...God is in charge...God is able.

Practice makes perfect. And it is much the same way with faith and prayer. The more you are focused on God rather than the problem, the more manageable the problem becomes. Now, fear can be a good thing. For example, you want your children to fear talking to strangers...and fear can keep you from walking into danger that could have been avoided. But most especially, fear can also take you to Jesus who forgives your sins and who promises to never leave you nor forsake you. It will be interesting to see where everything stands in our nation concerning the coronavirus, the deaths, and all of the restrictions. It seems to be changing every week (and for the better). Yet, come what may...Jesus is the same yesterday, today, and forever.

Until worship resumes inside the church building, we will continue to have drive in worship services here at St. Andrew. We will let you know when this worship arrangement will change. I also continue to lead Bible study online Wednesday nights at 7 (please contact me for further instructions if interested). <u>STEWARDSHIP</u>

What does it mean to be God's steward? This is the seventh article in an eight month series. We'll continue to look into different principles of being God's stewards based on His revealed

word. Our lives are lived to make a contribution to others in Christ's name.

Each month we will review one of the principles with a brief article, scripture to pray on, and a few questions to encourage growth.

- 1. God's stewards are God's stewards
- 2. God's stewards are managers, not owners
- 3. God's stewards are saints and sinners
- 4. God's stewards are uniquely singular, yet profoundly plural
- 5. God's stewards are in the world, but not of the world
- 6. God's stewards are loved and loving
- 7. God's stewards are served and serving
- 8. God's stewards live with an awareness of the present and the future, of time and eternity

God's Stewards Are Served and Serving This is a recognition that we live a Gospelpowered life of service. Our servant-hood is demonstrated in all aspects of our life.

Who comes to mind when you think of the word "servant"? Are they people who have impacted your life personally or impacted the congregation? The greatest example of a servant comes from Christ himself. His ultimate act of service for the whole world was his sacrifice on the cross. But his whole earthly life leading up to that also set the standard for us. He lived his life as a servant, washing feet, caring for the sick, and reminding us that the road to greatness is achieved by serving others first. We should challenge and encourage each other in compassion, love and charity that brings honor to God. It can be difficult to put others needs ahead of our own, but we have the benefit of our church family to help support each other.

One last thing to remember, our service is not bound to "church" activities. Our whole-life should be a reflection of God's Grace. Our lives should be a benefit to all of God's creation.
